#### NOTES

Most of the commonly-used forms are available as templates in Winlink, including the ICS 309. Address the message to your non-Winlink e-mail address, complete the form (click "Submit" at the very bottom left of the page) and post it to your Winlink outbox. You don't have to send the form. Go to your Winlink outbox, find the message and double click the paperclip to the left of the message header. When the form opens, navigate to the very bottom left of the page and click the "Print" button. From there you can either print a hard copy or Print to PDF (Windows X) or Save to PDF (Mac iOS) and archive the record. ICS 309 is not currently a fillable PDF form. It is intended for documenting communications as they occur in real time.
